As is our custom at Trinity, this Christmas we have again decided to not do any gift exchange with students or teachers. Instead, we would like to remember someone that could use extra help during the holidays. This year we have chosen the Luehring family. Pastor Luehring is the pastor at St. Johns, Woodville. The Luehring's 4-year-old daughter, Tabitha, was diagnosed this summer with a cancerous brain tumor. She has already gone through a surgery to remove as much of the tumor as they could, and now she is battling the cancer with chemotherapy. This project is near and dear to our hearts because nine of our Trinity students attend Pastor Luehring's church. We thank God every day that none of our Trinity students are battling cancer, and we pray that through our efforts we can help Tabitha and her family as they face the long road to recovery.

We have planned several fun ways that we can help to raise money for the Luehrings. Here is what we have planned for the month of December:

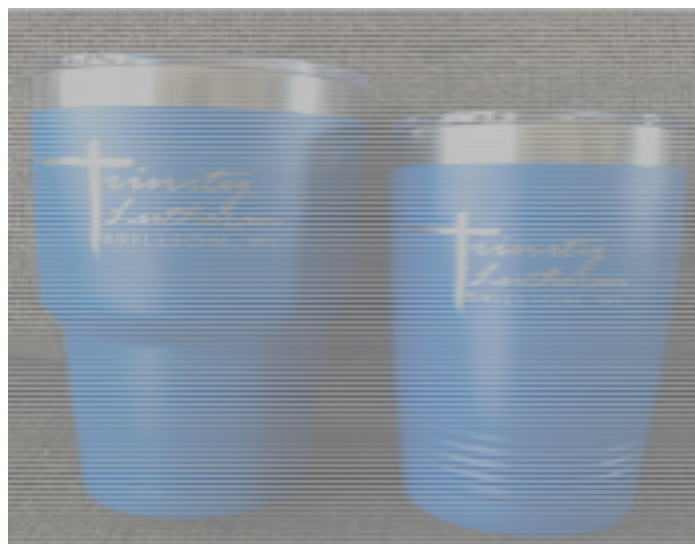
1. Have a free will offering at church, highlighted on the first Sunday in December and then have a box available for donations in the office for the remainder of the month.
2. Have a bake sale- "Favorite Christmas Cookies" on Sunday, December 9. Run by students, with teachers help. We will have cookies available between services. Free will offering on all.
3. Bracelet Sales- We will sell gold (color for Children's cancer) bracelets that say "We Stand Together". Available at school, basketball games, church and the bake sale.
4. Free Throw Fun- At halftime of all games on December 14, we will have a shooting contest like they do at MLHS. As prizes, we will give a Laffy Taffy Stick for a made free throw, a ring pop for a made three, and throw a whip crème pie at Mr. Johnson for a made full court shot☺. Cost would be \$1.00 to shoot. We will donate a portion of canteen sales on this day as well.
5. Tie fleece blankets – we will be making blankets for Tabitha and her brother Ian. We will also include cards made by the Trinity students.

6. Volunteer choir- students will sing at St. John's Woodville, date: TBA, sometime after the New Year.
7. Prayers, prayers, prayers!! - We will be remembering the Luehrings in our classroom prayers. Please remember them in your prayers at home.
