WEEKLY MESSAGE FROM PRINCIPAL MAROHN

WELSSA SELF STUDY TEAMS

The WELSSA Accreditation process begins with a self-study by the congregation and school based on 15 standards. The Fifteen Self-Study Standards for Lutheran Elementary Schools are intended to serve as a benchmark of quality by which WELS elementary schools can measure themselves. These standards reflect a Bible-based philosophy of education, reflect sound educational principles, and help schools maintain a high quality of Christian education. The primary reason why a school proceeds through a rigorous process of school accreditation is to improve. Every WELS school strives to serve God and His people in the very best way possible. When a school evaluates itself based on the Self-Study Standards, blessings for the school and its students will result.

Self-study teams are formed to evaluate Trinity Lutheran School's ministry (4K-8th grade) in relation to the standards. The self-study teams will determine if each standard is fully met, partially met, or not met. The team will also identify evidence to support their decision. The team will do this for each standard included in their section of the self-study. Once the team has completed this process for each standard, they will then identify strengths, areas for improvement, and recommendations for the ministry at Trinity to improve in this area.
