This individual was driven and hardworking, so naturally, they were given more and more to do. However, the end result for this person was increasing anxiety that was leading to burnout. Not good. We all have our limits. This individual wasn't sure where to turn or who to talk to. When we face situations like these, it is tough to know where to go.

When anxiety hits, many people turn to breathing exercises, yoga, or meditation to fix things. While these are wonderful things, they only provide a temporary solution to anxiety. Don't get me wrong, I encourage you to use these things that work for you, but there is an even better place to turn.

School Choice Information Night & BOLS Open Forum
Tuesday, January 20, 2026 @ 6pm (Trinity Commons)

Trinity will host a Parent Information Night on the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program (WPCP) on Tuesday, January 20th at 6pm, in the commons, open to anyone interested in learning more about this program. This will also serve as an "open forum" for parents to share any ideas, suggestions, questions, comments, or concerns with our BOLS members. The open forum will begin immediately after the WPCP presentation. This presentation will last about 15-20 minutes.

The WPCP allows families to qualify for a voucher that allows the student to attend Trinity for free. This voucher can be carried over each year, including for attending FVL or MLHS. No tuition! Imagine possible free tuition for grades 4K through 12th grade.

The entry points for this program are students going into 4K, Kindergarten, 1st grade, and 9th grade. Parents of current 3K, 4K, and K students should consider attending. Parents are able to apply for a "school choice voucher" to cover the cost of their child's education. Vouchers are awarded based on residency and income levels. Information on applying will be shared at this meeting.

Trinity will have application periods in February, March, April, May, and August. A current voucher could possibly be lost now if you do not apply right away in February. Please attend this meeting for more information on program changes.
